I. MEETING SUMMARY

A. Public Information Workshop Overview

The first in a series of three Public Information Workshops for the Camarillo Airport - Airport Layout Plan and Narrative Report project (ALP Update) was held in-person on Tuesday, April 18, 2023, from

5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Camarillo Public Library. While the workshop was set to begin at 5:30 p.m., guests began arriving approximately one hour prior due to project misinformation being circulated on independent social media platforms.

As guests entered the library, directional signs were posted guiding them to the community room. At the entrance of the community room, a welcome board was on display and a registration table was in place. Guests were greeted by members of the project team, were offered the option to sign in, provided a brief orientation of the meeting format, and were handed a two-sided English and Spanish project initiation fact sheet. There were 122 guests who signed in, and approximately 40 who opted not to sign in with a total of approximately 160 public attendees. In addition, Spanish and Mixteco interpreters were available to assist guests with language interpretation needs. While interpreters were available for the duration of the workshop, no requests for their services were received.





Upon entering the library community room, a project team member welcomed guests and were informed of the presentation that would begin momentarily. At approximately 5:30 p.m., the Airports Director, Keith Freitas, opened the workshop with a welcoming statement and project overview and a clarification of the misinformation being circulated by a third-party regarding potential air cargo activity at Camarillo Airport. The clarification is that the ALP Update project will not include plans to accommodate air cargo activity by operators of large air cargo aircraft (i.e., Amazon, FedEx, UPS, etc.). Announcements on the availability of Spanish and Mixteco interpretation and a question-and-answer session followed. After the question-and-answer session, guests had the



opportunity to visit the various exhibit boards displayed around the meeting room and ask questions of the project team.

After viewing the project exhibits, guests had the opportunity to write and submit comments via two comment stations near the meeting room's entrance/exit. Pens, bilingual comment forms, and a comment form submission box were available at each comment station.

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

What is an Airport Layout Plan?

An Airport Layout Plan (ALP) is a document that depicts the existing and planned facilities on an airport. FAA requires a current ALP in file to support grant funding decisions. Any project for which the Airport is seeking federal funding must be depicted on the ALP.

How is this done?

The FAA assists airports to meet this requirement through the funding of planning studies like master plans. In contrast to a full master plan, an ALP update satisfies FAA requirements without needing to consider changes to Camarillo Airport's role.

What is being studied?

The ALP Update will focus on identifying and prioritizing projects that will sustain Camarillo Airport's critical facilities, especially the runway and taxiways. It is essential that we receive funding from the FAA and take steps to remain eligible for grant funding.

Additionally, the study will focus on meeting or documenting compliance with evolving FAA safety standards, and identifying the best uses of airport property, both aviation-related and in the adjoining business park.

How is the community involved?

The Department of Airports is committed to working closely with our surrounding community members on airport issues that affect them. To that end, we are hosting a series of workshops to allow the community to share their experiences and learn more about the airport. Meetings and study materials will also be available in Spanish.

¿Qué es un plan de diseño aeroportuario?

Un plan de diseño aeroportuario (ALP) es un documento que describe las instalaciones existentes y las planeadas en un aeropuerto. La Administración Federal de Aviación (FAA) requiere un ALP actual en el expediente para justificar las decisiones de financiación por subvención. Todo proyecto para el Aeropuerto que requiera una financiación federal debe estar representado en el ALP.

¿Cómo se lleva a cabo?

La FAA ayuda a los aeropuertos en el cumplimiento de este requisito mediante la financiación de los estudios de planeación como los planes maestros. A diferencia de un plan maestro completo, la actualización de un ALP satisface los requisitos de la FAA sin tener que considerar cambios en la función del Aeropuerto Camarillo.

¿Qué estudios están involucrados?

La actualización del ALP se enfoca en identificar y priorizar los proyectos considerados en las principales instalaciones del Aeropuerto Camarillo, especialmente en las pistas de aterrizaje y pistas de rodaje. Es imprescindible que recibamos la financiación por parte de la FAA y adoptar medidas para seguir siendo elegibles para la financiación por subvención.

Además, el estudio se enfoca en el cumplimiento o en la documentación de cumplimiento de las cambiantes normas de seguridad de la FAA, así como en la identificación del mejor aprovechamiento de los bienes del aeropuerto, relacionados con la aviación y en el colindante parque empresarial.

¿Cómo está involucrada la comunidad?

El Departamento de Aeropuertos está comprometido a trabajar estrechamente con los miembros de nuestra comunidad aledaña en los problemas del aeropuerto que les afecta. Para esto, estamos organizando una serie de talleres para permitir que la comunidad comparta sus experiencias y aprendan más sobre el aeropuerto. A. Public Information Workshop Overview

On November 14, 2023, the second in a series of three Public Information Workshops for the Camarillo Airport - Airport Layout Plan and Narrative Report Project (ALP Update) was held inperson at the Camarillo Public Library.

The workshop was set to begin at 5:30 p.m., however, guests began arriving at approximately 5:00 p.m. As guests arrived, they were greeted by two project team members at the registration table, were provided with a brief overview of the meeting format, were offered the opportunity to sign in and handed a two-sided English and Spanish <u>project initiation information brochure</u> and <u>comment form</u>.

What is an Airport Layout Plan?

An Airport Layout Plan (ALP) is a document that depicts the existing and planned facilities on an airport. FAA requires a current ALP in file to support grant funding decisions. Any project for which the Airport is seeking federal funding must be depicted on the ALP.

How is this done?

The FAA assists airports to meet this requirement through the funding of planning studies like master plans. In contrast to a full master plan, an ALP update satisfies FAA requirements without needing to consider changes to Camarillo Airport's role.

What is being studied?

The ALP Update will focus on identifying and prioritizing projects that will sustain Camarillo Airport's critical facilities, especially the runway and taxiways. It is essential that we receive funding from the FAA and take steps to remain eligible for grant funding.

Additionally, the study will focus on meeting or documenting compliance with evolving FAA safety standards, and identifying the best uses of airport property, both aviation-related and in the adjoining business park.

How is the community involved?

The Department of Airports is committed to working closely with our surrounding community members on airport issues that affect them. To that end, we are hosting a series of workshops to allow the community to share their experiences and learn more about the airport. Meetings and study materials will also be available in Spanish.

La Administración Federal de Aviación (FAA) requiere un ALP actual en el expediente para justificar las decisiones de financiación por subvención. Todo proyecto para el Aeropuerto que requiera una financiación federal debe estar representado en el ALP.

¿Cómo se lleva a cabo?

La FAA ayuda a los aeropuertos en el cumplimiento de este requisito mediante la financiación de los estudios de planeación como los planes maestros. A diferencia de un plan maestro completo, la actualización de un ALP satisface los requisitos de la FAA sin tener que considerar cambios en la función del Aeropuerto Camarillo.

¿Qué estudios están involucrados?

La actualización del ALP se enfoca en identificar y priorizar los proyectos considerados en las principales instalaciones del Aeropuerto Camarillo, especialmente en las pistas de aterrizaje y pistas de rodaje. Es imprescindible que recibamos la financiación por parte de la FAA y adoptar medidas para seguir siendo elegibles para la financiación por subvención.

Además, el estudio se enfoca en el cumplimiento o en la documentación de cumplimiento de las cambiantes normas de seguridad de la FAA, así como en la identificación del mejor aprovechamiento de los bienes del aeropuerto, relacionados con la aviación y en el colindante parque empresarial.

I. MEETING SUMMARY

A. Public Information Meeting Overview

On February 20, 2024, the final in a series of three Public Information Meetings for the Camarillo Airport - Airport Layout Plan and Narrative Report Project (ALP Update) was held in-person at the Ventura County Office of Education in Camarillo. Spanish and Mixteco interpreters were available to assist attendees with interpretation needs, however, no interpretation requests were made at the Public Information Meeting.

The meeting was set to begin at 6:00 p.m., however, guests began arriving at approximately 5:30 p.m. In total, approximately 153 guests participated in the meeting with 143 guests who signed in

and an estimated additional 10 guests who opted to not sign in.

Immediately outside of the meeting conference room, a welcome board was on display adjacent to the registration table where attendees were greeted by project team members. Attendees were offered the opportunity to sign in, provided with a brief overview of the meeting format, a project brochure, a double-sided English and Spanish question card and a writing pen.



After checking in, guests were directed to the conference room where light refreshments were available. Six large flat monitors were stationed around the room to ensure an equal view of the project PowerPoint presentation. Two comment tables and chairs, English and Spanish comment forms, pens and comment form collection boxes were located in the central backside of the meeting room to allow guests to take a seat and write and submit comments on the project at their convenience. No comment forms were submitted at the public information meeting.

The Airport staff and the Coffman Associates technical team were seated on a raised platform in a speaker panel style table oriented toward the meeting room to respond to questions. The panel line up included the Ventura County Department of Airports team Keith Freitas, Erin Powers, Dave Nafie and the Coffman Associates technical team Matt Quick, Patrick Thomas and Kory Lewis. A podium was stationed on the raised panel for use by the speakers.



The formal <u>presentation</u> opened with announcements on the availability of Spanish and Mixteco interpreters, housekeeping items and the options available for submitting questions and comments by Stacey Falcioni. Keith Freitas followed with a welcome message and presented the project



schedule, Joint Powers Agreement, and what is being done to address noise concerns. Patrick Taylor provided an in-depth presentation on the Airport Layout Plan (ALP) and process. Jannette Jauregui shared frequently asked questions along with responses and Stacey Falcioni moderated the Question-and-Answer session by verbally reading submitted written questions. Approximately 68 question cards were submitted and are summarized below.

Question Cards

Airport Development

- 1. Do not accept FAA funding, locate alternate funding source for the ALP update.
- 2. Plan for empty hangars in Central Terminals (T's)?
- 3. Update of the taxiway and other hardscapes to enable higher frequency of operations.
- 4. How does the expansion of the airport benefit citizens of Camarillo?
- 5. Will the Camarillo Airport, Ventura County Department of Airports, or City of Camarillo profit from the expansion?
- Enforcement of the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) by the Airport Authority to ensure airport users are being compliant, potentially by fining those who do not comply.
- Distinction of the JPA between turbo prop and jets and utilization of the JPA to minimize the number of jets that can utilize the airport.
- Provide Camarillo resident concerns to the FAA; ALP agency update meetings.
- Prioritization of projects within the ALP update.
- Support of local pilots and airport employees for the ALP update.
- 11. Cost of maintenance and upkeep for the projects scoped for the ALP update.
- 12. (Provide) sustainable update as part of the ALP update.
- 13. (Need for) runway reconstruction weight bearing capacity and maintenance of the high-speed turnoffs.





14. Potential development at other Ventura County airport to mitigate the need for the ALP update.

Cargo/Airline Service

- 15. Limit the number of smaller aircrafts and corporate jets.
- 16. Relocation of flight path to avoid flying low over residences.
- 17. There is an increase in jet usage of airport since pandemic.



What is an Airport Layout Plan?

An Airport Layout Plan (ALP) is a document that depicts the existing and planned facilities on an airport. FAA requires a current ALP in file to support grant funding decisions. Any project for which the Airport is seeking federal funding must be depicted on the ALP.

How is this done?

The FAA assists airports to meet this requirement through the funding of planning studies like master plans. In contrast to a full master plan, an ALP update satisfies FAA requirements without needing to consider changes to Camarillo Airport's role.

What is being studied?

The ALP Update will focus on identifying and prioritizing projects that will sustain Camarillo Airport's critical facilities, especially the runway and taxiways. It is essential that we receive funding from the FAA and take steps to remain eligible for grant funding.

Additionally, the study will focus on meeting or documenting compliance with evolving FAA safety standards, and identifying the best uses of airport property, both aviation-related and in the adjoining business park.

How is the community involved?

The Department of Airports is committed to working closely with our surrounding community members on airport issues that affect them. To that end, we are hosting a series of workshops to allow the community to share their experiences and learn more about the airport. Meetings and study materials will also be available in Spanish.

On behalf of the City of Camarillo, I want to express my appreciation for your efforts in engaging the Camarillo community in the Airport Layout Plan process (ALP). I recognize that public participation in the ALP is not required by the FAA and applaud your efforts to incorporate public participation into your ALP process in an effort to inform Camarillo residents and to seek their input.

The City understands that, at a general level, the County is obligated to make Camarillo Airport available for aeronautical use, to maintain an ALP, and to improve the Airport in conformity with the FAA-approved ALP. At a more detailed level, the County is obligated to maintain facilities improved with federal grants, to operate the Airport safely, and to consider requests from private entities to make improvements with private funds.

The City recognizes that the County does not have legal rights to place restrictions on aircraft in flight, nor may the County impose restrictions or mandatory flight restrictions. The FAA has exclusive jurisdiction over airspace, aircraft and pilots. The City understands that Ventura County cannot close the Camarillo Airport; rather, the County is obligated by contracts with FAA requiring County to keep airport open as well as by restrictive covenants in the deed by which the airport was transferred from the United States Government.

The City acknowledges that the ALP does not include any airport expansion, rather the focus is on infrastructure, parking, ramps, maintenance. We also understand that the County is not obligated to construct improvements simply because those improvements are depicted on the FAA-approved ALP. The County is the owner and operator of the Airport and will decide whether and when to apply for FAA grant funding and/or to use other airport revenues or debt to make the identified improvements.

Although we have a clear understanding of the County's obligations for the ALP, as well as your role in operating the Camarillo Airport, it is imperative that the Ventura County Department of Airports balance the Airport's needs with those of the surrounding community.

The City is interested in solutions to address the quality-of-life issues that are being raised repeatedly by Camarillo residents. We ask that you move forward now to pursue opportunities to engage in permanent noise monitoring opportunities. We also ask you to seek opportunities

to safely adjust the flightpath over Old Town Camarillo to minimize disruption to the quality of life of Camarillo residents.

In all that you do, we are counting on you to continue to uphold the 1976 Agreement, as committed to in the letter from the County to the City, dated January 19, 2022, and since that time through verbal and written correspondence between the two entities. Additionally, we encourage you to continue engaging with Camarillo residents in all airport-related matters that have the potential to impact quality of life.

As always, I am available at your convenience to discuss this matter. We value our partnership with the County in planning for the future of this important community asset, and the City will continue to dedicate the time, attention and energy necessary to find a resolution on these issues.

LAFCo staff has reviewed the Final Draft Airport Layout Plan (ALP) and Narrative Report, and provides the following comments. The comments provided in this letter are those of LAFCo staff and do not reflect determinations made by the Commission.

As background, LAFCo's purposes are to (1) discourage urban sprawl, (2) preserve open space and prime agricultural land, (3) ensure efficient provision of government services, and (4) encourage the orderly formation and development of local agencies, such as cities (Government Code § 56301). LAFCo implements its mission in part through its actions related to local agencies' requests for boundary changes and service provision.

LAFCo staff requests that the County expand upon the statement "Sanitary sewer services are provided by Ventura County" contained within the Final Draft ALP and Narrative Report, to reflect the following facts:

The County of Ventura, through its Water and Sanitation Department, owns, operates, and maintains the wastewater collection infrastructure for the Camarillo Airport facility. Wastewater is discharged from the airport to the Camarillo Sanitary District's (District's)¹ sewer system, an arrangement that has been in place since the 1960s (and likely since 1955, predating earliest District records). The wastewater is then treated at the District's treatment facility.

Additionally, in 2017, the District and the County entered into an extraterritorial service agreement to authorize the District to provide sewer service outside its jurisdictional boundaries to allow for the development of new aircraft hangars at the northeast corner of the Camarillo Airport within an approximately 20-acre area. The agreement, approved by LAFCo, allowed the direct connection of the development project to the District's collection system

¹ The Camarillo Sanitary District is authorized to provide wastewater collection and treatment service within its jurisdictional boundaries (i.e., within and surrounding the City of Camarillo). In some circumstances, pursuant to LAFCo approval, it may also provide services outside its jurisdictional area. The City Council of the City of Camarillo is the governing body of the District.

(bypassing the County's existing infrastructure) due to proximity of the development site to existing District pipelines. An amendment to the agreement, approved by LAFCo in 2022, extended the 5-year term of the original agreement by an additional 5-year period, to accommodate the District's desire for additional time to pursue LAFCo approval of the annexation of the entire Camarillo Airport facility, in order to provide sufficient time for the County to improve the existing sewer infrastructure at the airport to meet the District's standards.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide expanded detail regarding the circumstances surrounding wastewater services that are provided at the Camarillo Airport, and for your consideration in incorporating this information into the Final ALP Update and Narrative Report. Climate First: Replacing Oil & Gas (CFROG) is a grassroots environmental nonprofit dedicated to combating the climate crisis by working to shape the transition away from fossil fuels to a carbon-free economy in Ventura County. We advocate for transparent and public environmental decision-making processes that appropriately consider public health and the climate crisis. CFROG, and our members in the Camarillo area, are concerned about the increase in jet and turboprop plane traffic at the Camarillo Airport due to the significant pollution increase and negative impacts on health, safety, and our climate.

As a city located right in the middle of the fastest-warming county in the lower United States, it is essential for Camarillo to prioritize reducing emissions and seriously consider the impacts of this pollution on community member health and safety. Emissions from aviation are a significant contributor to climate change and these emissions are growing faster than any other mode of transport. Air pollution from aircrafts can also have direct negative impacts on respiratory and cardiovascular health in nearby communities. The Plan's forecasted doubling in jet and turboprop operations within the next 10 years, and then another doubling in the 10 years after that, introduces an unacceptable level of harmful pollution into the air community members breathe and our climate.

CFROG urges the Ventura County Department of Airports, FAA, Camarillo City Council, Ventura County Board of Supervisors, and the Airport Authority Board to protect the Camarillo community by:

- Conducting an alternative flight path study
- Establish permanent noise monitoring equipment in place
- Complete an emissions and air quality analysis
- Limit airport business expansion (no new large hangars or Fixed Based Operators that service turbine engine aircraft.

Coffman has done their usual good work.

A few notes for your consideration:

- I think there is a typo on page 3-2. The true bearing of the runway is not 186.05 (or maybe I misread something).
- Perhaps beyond your purview, but airport management should be given "some" idea of the "ultimate" strength of the pavement (how heavy a plane can it handle for a one time or just a few times events). My memory is a little sketchy, but some years back they allowed a C-17 (in for an airshow) to use Taxiway A and it basically busted up the asphalt pavement. I saw the taxiway afterward and alerted the tower. You can see the section of pavement they replaced in the current pictures. There is an engineering limit. Again, even sketchier memory, some years back, the Air Force had their people come in and do core samples at various points on the runway, before (I think) they brought in a B-52 (for an airshow).
- It will be a long time or never, before a parallel runway happens. CMA gets very busy at times. Perpendicular taxiway exits will slow down operations. Certainly incursions are a worry, but also having a lot of planes in the air, in the pattern, holding outside 5 miles would have an impact on safety in the area. Current geometry is sort of "high speed" exits helping to get planes off the runway.
- As noted above, CMA gets busy. Changing / limiting the holding pads in the runup areas (especially A) will pile up a lot of waiting airplanes, all the way down "G" and probably back up "H" at times. Is there any other / better way to deal with the runup area. Frustrated people sometimes then feel rushed and sometimes make errors in judgement.
- Thanks for your consideration. I know, FAA dictates hold sway over most things. But, there are impacts.

I am concerned about the increase in jet and turboprop plane traffic at the Camarillo Airport because of noise and air pollution is **impacting my** health, and safety concerns and it is annoying change to cummunity feel of Camarillo..

A few times a year a plane will crash near the fields of the airport, however it will be a more of a safety concern since they are building near/on Springville development. Where will they go for an emergency / crash landings? Most of the population of Camarillo moved here for the cleaner air and no noise from an airport. We do not use airports very much, but when we need one, the trip to Burbank or LAX is part of the adventure. If someone uses an airport a lot then they should move to be near one and not live in Ventura County.

Now Camarillo is paying the price for the convenience of wealthy individuals and the profits of private jet businesses at the Airport. How the County is benefitting while our community's health and safety is being put at risk.

How does this violate the 1975 contract with the City of Camarillo and the County of Ventura? It seems that it does just by the fact of expanding the airport and more larger airplanes coming here every 10 years.

Private jets emit at least 10 times more pollutants than commercial planes per passenger.

The takings clause of the Fifth Amendment does not grant Federal, state, county or local government a special exception for airports or federal agencies to degrade or make your property uninhabitable.

From Camarillo Airports inception, Ventura County and the FAA has politically steamrolled the citizens of Camarillo forcing this airport into this very poor location without concern or care for how it impacts and degrades the private properties surrounding this airport and negatively affecting resident's health.

I am a psychotherapist working with patients in Old Town and lead wellbeing science research. I hold graduate degrees in Psychology from Northwestern and Cambridge University. I can personally and professionally attest to noise as one of the few factors that individuals can control to significantly reduce levels of stress, and cortisol; while increasing mood and wellbeing. Noise exposure has significant effects on physical health, mental health, and daily functioning. Louder, closer, and more frequent disruptions force a multitude of significant negative outcomes on individuals. I, myself, live in Old Town. The noise levels have acute effects above the minimum decibel for mental dysregualtion, including during hours of sleep, according to the noise study data. The levels are well above the threshold to chronically and cumulatively affect mental health. There are countless nights when I am awaken from jets and there are several times when I see patients who have significantly negative chronic outcomes to their health. Noise disturbance improvement in Old Town would be of great benefit to all of the residents and visitors - via flight paths diversions or reduction of large jets. It is essential to consider these individual and community health effects that are not accounted for in the official noise study and current consideration of the airport plan.

I find it interesting that even though the operations number has increased significantly in the past 4 years, particularly with local ops growing 50% (and nearly 11% CAGR), that the "official" estimate in this ALP for growth for the next 20yrs is just 0.73%. While it was noted that in 2022 we were at about 81% of capacity due to the single runway configuration of CMA, it was also noted that the current airport master plan (2011) calls for the addition of a second runway which would up that capacity by 54% (though it was fairly noted that there is currently no near- or intermediate-term plan to do so), leading to a large increase in activity in and around the airport. Many folks are concerned about the noise/quality of life impacts of such increased activity at CMA.

My name is Linda DeMonte and I've lived in Camarillo since July 2014. I live in the Laurel Park neighborhood, which is not as directly impacted by increasing jet traffic as the Old Town Neighborhood, but impacted, nonetheless.

I am concerned about the notable increase in jet and turboprop plane traffic at the Camarillo Airport because of the increasing volume and frequency of the noise, the air pollution, and potential safety hazards. This will negatively impact our quality of life, and our property values.

When we moved to this home in 2015, we were asked to sign a waiver indicating there would be occasional airplane noise, mostly from the military base, and not overly frequent. That has been the case for many years, however it is impossible to ignore that the noise and frequency has greatly increased, and it seems to be from corporate jets and large aircraft - not military.

Dear Camarillo City and Ventura County Leaders,

My name is Wendy Nicolle, and I am a Camarillo resident. I was born in Oxnard and raised in Camarillo. I was fortunate to return home after living in Central California for school and the Bay Area and Los Angeles counties for work. Even though Camarillo and Ventura County have grown over the years, it is still the best place to live in the state. We have great weather, clean air, blue skies, open land, good schools, and a safe community.

I am concerned about Camarillo Airport's increased jet and turboprop plane traffic. There are real estate ads from CloudNine for hangers that can house "up to the largest corporate jets such as the Global 7500 and Gulfstream 700," with key selling points as "a prime location and opportunity for entertainment industry professionals, local executives, international firms." Edward Atsinger III of The Salem Media Group and Sun Air Jets, LLC, says, "Right now, you can be [in Camarillo] faster than you can be in Van Nuys if you live in Malibu. We've watched these airports located not necessarily immediately in the middle of the urban areas but adjacent, and we're very bullish about their future."

The City of Camarillo and Ventura Country must work together to prevent overdevelopment at the cost of the quality of life in Ventura County. I was surprised that CloudNine has a fifty-year lease, a waiting list for hangars, and a plan for more hangar construction. I look around and see empty buildings and non-local corporations buying shopping centers and raising the rent. Yet more construction occurs as rents increase and long-standing tenants close their doors.

In addition to noise, safety, pollution, environmental impact, and disruption, the airport layout plan raises more questions than answers. The answer seems simple. Do not take the grants. The FAA does not want to control the airport – it sets safety standards. We already have a commercial airport in Oxnard. There are better ways to improve the community by attracting businesses that will enhance the environment, create jobs, and improve the quality of life for area residents by keeping property values high and having unique offerings for families.

Camarillo Airport does not have a Noise Ordinance. The restriction is no takeoffs before 5:00 AM unless the airport director approves. As such, the city and county have few ways to control time, noise, or the number of flights. One must ask, is our community a parking spot where one can fly at one's convenience at the locals' expense? In contrast, the hobbyists in propeller planes do not fly at all hours, scream a jet over houses, and tout their tax dollars. The few who can afford corporate jets can utilize nearby airports, such as Los Angeles, Van Nuys, Santa Barbara, Burbank, Long Beach, Santa Ana, and, for now, Santa Monica. If the city needs to generate additional income, let's find a better way to preserve what makes our city and county such a wonderful place to live and raise families. While living in Long Beach, in addition to being woken up in the middle of the night, smelling jet fuel, seeing a frightening situation when a jet failed to take off safely, and having to stop a conversation during work or a backyard gathering to let a plane fly by, I don't want to look up and see jets flying in and out of our city all day and all night, blocking the beautiful views that we luckily have.

I'm asking for your help to protect me and my community. Complete the noise study and the environmental impact study accepting the ALP. My family, who have lived here their entire lives, know little about the airport activities. Conduct more outlined.

I have been a resident of Camarillo Old Town neighborhood since 1950. Camarillo has always been a special place to live - excellent weather, small town atmosphere, and friendly people. Today as I relax inside my house on a Tuesday morning, an enormous dark shadow darkens my house in an instant, as a large low flying jet streaks over my house - 3 times in 10 minutes!

I am deeply disturbed by the destruction of the quality of life in my neighborhood due to the INCESSANT NOISE, AIR POLLUTION, and INTERFERENCE caused by airplanes flying DIRECTLY over my house at low altitudes ALL DAY! I worry about SAFTY for my family!

This is due to an INTRUSIVE flight landing track for CAMARILLO AIRPORT!

It is not possible to enjoy a heathy life in my residence due to these flight incursions.

For example, on SUNDAY morning, April 28, 2024 between 9am and 10:15am, 17 planes flew at low altitudes directly over my house on the landing path to Camarillo Airport. This is an average of a plane disrupting my Sunday morning every 4 minutes-30 seconds! The call marks on the fuselages are often visible. The plane shadows streak across my yard. This parade of noise and object pollution over my house continues throughout the day.

During the busiest times, the planes are landing on average every 90 seconds. This is about 18 or 20 planes every 30 minutes. The noise is disgustingly CONTINUOUS!

I cannot sit outside in our garden and have a decent conversation without interruption. My sleep is interrupted at 1am in the morning by large incoming jets. I feel my family lives under a "freeway" for airplanes.

I have respiratory and high blood pressure health issues which are not helped by this situation, if not a direct result of this situation.

I recently invested \$175,000 on new construction on my property. The value of my property is degraded substantially by the presence of low altitude planes directly over my house!

I do not understand these very LOW overflights when touchdown is 3 miles away. Also, I have SEEN planes avoiding the neighborhood entirely by banking to land much closer to the runway and much farther Southwest over open fields. This is an Southwest of the end of Carmen Drive. I KNOW IT'S POSSIBLE!

Comments re: Camarillo Airport Layout Plan

I would like to comment about how the ALP could potentially affect birds.

According to the Biological Resources Assessment by Coffman and Associates, Burrowing Owls and Northern Harriers have been observed on the grasslands in and around the airport As you may know, both species are listed as species of concern, and are protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. Burrowing Owl populations have been declining since the early 1990's (DeSante, Institute For Bird Populations), and Northern Harriers have declined by 34% since 1966 (North American Breeding Bird Survey).

.At present, the Airport Layout Plan will not have a major impact on birds, since the grasslands at the airport will not be affected. However, it should be noted that Burrowing Owls and Northern Harriers have been observed in the area. Any future changes to the airport that include the development of the grassland area should be studied for potential impacts on these two species. Other raptors—red-winged hawks and red-shouldered hawks—use the grassland as foraging ground. Last but not least, ground-nesting birds, such as red-winged blackbirds and western meadowlarks, inhabit the grasslands during breeding season.

I am concerned about the continued survival of these species, and hope that you will take local wildlife into account when considering future development of the airport area.

My name is Erin Haven and I'm a 5-year resident of Old Town in Camarillo. We love raising our children in Old Town, because it is safe, is an easy walking distance to local restaurants, and, until recently, was relatively quiet. We enjoy watching the propellor planes flying overhead and host an annual backyard BBQ with friends to watch the air show. However, with the increasing jet, turboprop, and helicopter air traffic, I do not envision us living in this area for too much longer. These loud aircraft have become increasingly disruptive to our quality of life. They descend directly over our house, rattling our windows while I work from home and disrupting our sleep, especially my toddler's naps. I do not enjoy spending time in our backyard as much now because these large aircraft are passing over us so frequently. At times, I have felt trapped in my house because extremely loud aircraft are circling directly over the house, and I cannot escape the sounds whether I'm inside or outside. When I have tried to submit noise complaints online, the website repeatedly has given me errors messages. Consequently, I have struggled to express my concerns through the appropriate channels.

I believe it is short-sighted to allow for continued increases in jet, turboprop, and helicopter traffic as predicted in the ALP. While we allow private corporations and individuals to use our airport as a landing point for their business and leisure activities, we will drive out our own citizens. Old Town and other nearby neighborhoods will become undesirable areas to live, and patrons will not want to frequent local restaurants and other businesses due to the noise.

I respectfully request the following: conduct an alternative flight path study, install permanent noise monitoring equipment, and very carefully consider citizen concerns as you evaluate each new proposal under the 2024 ALP (e.g., future building projects). I also request that the approved repaving and center line project be used as an opportunity to re-evaluate the location of the center line and potentially move it south as part of noise abatement efforts. I believe having these large aircraft descend over the fields would reduce the impact of their noise significantly, thus improving the quality of life for your community members.

We can't enjoy our patio like we used to, when we watch to we have to pause or increase the volume to even hear the dialog. Because planes come in at all hours of the night and early morning our sleep patterns are also frequently disrupted and as a consequence this it negatively effects how you function the next day. With increased air traffic comes increased air pollution and of course noise pollution. In addition and certainly not insignificant, the increased chance of air disaster in the neighborhood. Our quality of life and our health have certainly been negatively effected by the increased air traffic and will continue to compound as time goes on given the current level.

Now, having said all of the above we are told that it is projected that the air traffic will possibly double for jet and turboprop in 10 years and possibly doubling again in another 10 years. I can't even imagine that based on the issues we have now with the current traffic level.

It seems that the City and County continue to support the growth in volume of the jet and turboprop traffic. Look at some of the projects that have been approved such as the construction of Luxury hangers. Like the old saying goes "build it and they will come". Some of the FBO's are open 24/7 to support international traffic which encourages more traffic at odd hours having a greater negative impact (sleep disruption) for those of us that are under the flight path. All of the FBO's are advertising trying to increase their business. I get it, they are business and that is what businesses do try to generate revenue. Given the type of traffic increase we are seeing it is for those who are fortunate enough to be able to own their own aircraft or afford to travel in luxury. Good for them, but for those of us that are disproportionately affected by the negative consequences, not so good.

Our City and County officials need to consider the negative effects of trying to increase revenue via the airport. In addition, about mitigation of the current traffic level for those who are affected? Such as: air traffic study to change the approach pattern,

noise monitoring, pollution monitoring, regular meetings between the community and airport officials and FBO's and County and City Officials to help facilitate mitigation solutions.

We are all citizens and deserve representation and protection from our elected officials. Please do your job.....

Climate First: Replacing Oil & Gas (CFROG) is a grassroots environmental nonprofit dedicated to combating the climate crisis by working to shape the transition away from fossil fuels to a carbon-free economy in Ventura County. We advocate for transparent and public environmental decision-making processes that appropriately consider public health and the climate crisis. CFROG, and our members in the Camarillo area, are concerned about the increase in jet and turboprop plane traffic at the Camarillo Airport due to the significant pollution increase and negative impacts on health, safety, and our climate.

As a city located right in the middle of the fastest-warming county in the lower United States, it is essential for Camarillo to prioritize reducing emissions and seriously consider the impacts of this pollution on community member health and safety. Emissions from aviation are a significant contributor to climate change and these emissions are growing faster than any other mode of transport. Air pollution from aircrafts can also have direct negative impacts on respiratory and cardiovascular health in nearby communities. The Plan's forecasted doubling in jet and turboprop operations within the next 10 years, and then another doubling in the 10 years after that, introduces an unacceptable level of harmful pollution into the air community members breathe and our climate.

CFROG urges the Ventura County Department of Airports, FAA, Camarillo City Council, Ventura County Board of Supervisors, and the Airport Authority Board to protect the Camarillo community by:

- Conducting an alternative flight path study
- Establish permanent noise monitoring equipment in place
- Complete an emissions and air quality analysis
- Limit airport business expansion (no new large hangars or Fixed Based Operators that service turbine engine aircraft.

On page 2-28 of the Aviation Demand Forecast document of the Camarillo Airport Layout Plan Update, Table 2N "Fleet Mix Operations Forecast" calls for a doubling of jet and turboprop operations to 27,000 operations per year within the next 10 years... and then nearly doubling again to 49,000 jet and turboprop operations/year in the following 10 years. This does not include the increase in piston plane and helicopter operations, as well.

All of these aircraft will be burning either AV jet fuel or leaded piston plane fuel over the Camarillo community. The onshore ocean winds blow these emissions southeastward over Camarillo, along the hillsides, over the Mission Oaks area and then up the Santa Rosa Valley. Jet fuel nanoparticles that lodge deep in the lungs and most adversely impact the young and the elderly, and lead used in piston plane fuels, drift down on children and families using playgrounds, community parks, and home backyards.

Within 1 mile of the airport are two preschools (Mt. Cross Lutheran Church preschool, Pleasant Valley Bible preschool), two elementary schools (Las Posas elementary school, CAPE charter school), one middle school (Monte Vista middle school), and three high-school/alternative schools (Gateway Community school, Phoenix school and Frontier HS)...a total of 6 schools closest to the airport and airplane operations emissions. Also within 1 mi, directly under the inbound flight path, is the Camarillo Estates Mobile Home park occupied by 55+ residents and a Healthcare rehabilitation center for those weak and recovering from a hospital stay or too infirmed to be home.

Our community (especially the newer Springville neighborhood of 1300 homes, and the older mid-town corridor along the freeway) is already impacted by the use of pesticides on the Oxnard Plain agricultural fields, the car and truck pollution from the frequent traffic jams on the 101, and the current 187,000 airplane operations, large and small, at the Camarillo Airport. The forecasted increase in larger jet and turboprop air traffic will add to the cumulative air pollution burden in Camarillo...and in Ventura County.

With Ventura County identified as being the fastest warming county in the contiguous United States, an emissions study to evaluate both the climate and health impacts of this forecasted 400% increase in jet and turboprop operations is imperative data needed to inform policy and decision-making. The Camarillo Airport's prior California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents are from 14 to 20 years old, and none included an emissions analysis.

The Airport Layout Plan Aviation Forecast's significant projected increase in airport traffic, due in large part to private jet an turboprop operations, must be responsibly addressed by our government agencies and our elected representatives. It is your role

and duty to prioritize the health and safety of residents. An emissions/air quality study would collect the data needed to most effectively respond to this situation, and citizen's concerns.

In addition, the Adopted Airport Comprehensive Land Use Plan for Camarillo Airport (Introduction and Inventory document, page 1-33, Exhibit 1K) is outdated. The Springville neighborhood of 1300 homes approx. 1/2 mile from the Airport is denoted in light green as "agriculture". This change in the land use in such close proximity to the airport should be noted as rezoned and developed since this map was adopted by the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) in July, 2000...24 years ago.

My husband and I retired to Camarillo in 2017. Since that time, we have seen the Camarillo Airport and flight operations increase exponentially.

- 1. Also, Aircraft have increased in size to what appears to be 737 size. And there are various noisy corporate type jets. Now we are not in the flight path, however I hear early in the morning the gunning of jet engines getting ready for takeoff. It sounds like LAX. As I go through my day, I am constantly reminded I have a large commercial airport right in my backyard. We did not retire to Camarillo or would we have if we knew the Camarillo Airport had big plans for expansion.
- 2. I'd be curious if the large jet engines exceed a agreed upon decibels requirement. From my research, Jet Engine noise is at the top of the scale with 135dBs from as close as 100 yards. Anything over 70dBs are harmful. Think about the farm workers, school children, shoppers, etc., that are right in the flight path or near the airport. The source for this information is from the Hearing Health Foundation, hearinghealthfoundation.org
- 3. Next the gigantic Amazon hub warehouse was put conveniently next to the airport, for what appears to be for a future supply chain strategy. How easy it would be to have Amazon serviced aircraft, land in Camarillo, and truck the goods next door to the Amazon warehouse.
- 4. Another in your face expansion is the erecting of two gigantic hangars that have been built for celebrity jets and ride sharing. Tell me this doesn't sound commercial! My daughter who works in Calabasas, has been told by her celebrity clients, if you want an easy way to fly, go out of Camarillo! Celebrities use Camarillo as their convenient, no hassle jump off point to destinations from U.S. to overseas. Think about it, Camarillo is close to Calabasas, Malibu, Montecito, Hidden Hills, etc.
- 5. Worst but last, the citizens of Camarillo (Men, Women, and Children) are being exposed to harmful chemicals from jet engine emissions. One only has to look at our cars that are constantly being covered with a dark fine powder.

We do support our military airbases because they are doing our country's work and protecting its citizens. And frankly, the is much more considerate of the Camarillo citizens. We are informed when a necessary uptick in aircraft will occur due to exercise.

We respectfully request our leaders, FAA, and empowered government to please halt the expansion of Camarillo Airport. Additionally, ideally disallow jet engine aircraft. Minimally, reduce size of aircraft. No more 737 size or large corporate jets. Reduce decibel output. Perform a study at different distances of what the output is. Also, study the environment. Measure the emissions and pollution we are being exposed to. Not to mention the wildlife that are affected. The nearby Red Hawk breeding zone which covers Spanish Hills to the Airport readily comes to mind.

My name is Susan McDonald and I have resided in Old Town Camarillo for 36.5 years. I am extremely concerned about the jet and turboprop plane traffic at the Camarillo Airport. In addition, I am also concerned about the projection of a massive increase in plane activity and little to no plans to manage the effect this will have on the residents in Camarillo.

When I moved here in 1987, plans flew in over the open space/fields south of the city of Camarillo. Over the past 4-5 years, planes have gotten much bigger and louder and over time, their landing pattern has shifted. They now fly low and loud directly over homes. The noise level is extremely disruptive, to the point of having to pause television due to excessive noise, pausing conversation/music when trying to enjoy time outside and disrupting sleep at night. I am also concerned about the effect of the pollution that these private jets produce, the health and safety of Camarillo residents, as well as property values.

I have read the portion of the ALP final draft regarding the fly friendly program. If I am reading the visual correctly, planes are encouraged to not fly directly over the homes, and instead, to fly over the open fields to the south and along the 101 freeway. My home is on the edge of the fields and I have not seen one single plane flying over the fields. EVERY single plane flies over my home, low and loud. I would like to know how pilots are encouraged/reminded to fly friendly. What data is taken and how are pilots who are not flying friendly reminded? What incentives are there to fly friendly? At the public meetings I have attended, the fly friendly program is the standard answer to residents' concerns regarding noise. Since this seems to be the only plan, I am asking for your help- show us data regarding the numbers of pilots participating and share plans regarding how to increase pilot participation in this program. I moved to Camarillo to begin my career and I am still here in retirement. When moving here my wife and I specifically looked in the Old Town neighborhood because it was small and quiet, with quaint shopping and walkable, traffic-free streets. We felt very fortunate to be able to rent and then own a house in this ideal neighborhood. We have raised our family here and remodeled to have this house continue to be what we desire.

Old Town has grown and prospered, our neighborhood and property value have gone up over the years. There has only been one negative, and only one thing that has lowered the value of our home:

Large jets landing in Camarillo with their noise pollution, visual pollution, and air pollution.

This was not a problem when we moved here nor for most of these years and has become dramatically worse in recent years. Public officials and airport officials seem to be welcoming this increase in noise and pollution but I have not heard any support from any residents affected by the flightpath. These are residents in several neighborhoods of

Camarillo who agree this jet problem has gotten too big, and intends to get worse.

Camarillo has always been a quiet, peaceful community and when compared to other places in the county or other urban areas nearby it is remarkable idyllic while providing conveniences and opportunities for all its residents. None of that is enhanced by the private jets of others flying overhead. The jets make life worse here. We all spend time outdoors and many of us do not have air conditioning and enjoy open windows and doors, but the jets make it impossible to enjoy. Our neighborhood does not really have through streets so we do not even have much car traffic. We often get more jets overhead than cars passing on our street during a day. The jets are not like the small propeller planes we used to have alone, or like cars on the street. They are like a freight train going through our community.

A most popular time. Sundays with your family on a day off? That day is the worst! If those aren't your relaxing times, how about the middle of the night? Large jets fly in during the wee hours of the night with no landing curfew. I don't think anyone involved in this would want that for their neighborhood and family. None of us want this for ours.

Please investigate noise monitoring, alternative flight paths and landing, and a complete night curfew. These will be a good start

and any plans to increase and develop this blight would be harmful and disagreeable.

If convenience for the very rich and money for the County are what matters, carry on. City Council Confirms Commitment to Preserving Camarillo's Quality of Life During Update on Camarillo Airport

Council Advises Airport Authority to Vigorously Advocate to Uphold 1976 Agreement

Camarillo, CA – During the Camarillo City Council meeting on Wednesday, April 10, 2024, City staff shared an update on two long-range planning processes currently underway for the Camarillo Airport—the Airport Layout Plan (ALP) Update and Part 150 Study. Councilmembers listened to residents and businesses who spoke during an extensive public comment period, then engaged in a question-and-answer session with Ventura County Airport Director Keith Freitas and special counsel Dan Reimer, an airport legal specialist retained by the City.

While the City does not have any decision-making authority on these specific processes or airport matters in general, the Council affirmed that it will continue to strongly advocate for the interests of the Camarillo community through its long-standing 1976 Joint Powers Agreement with Ventura County on the operation of the Camarillo Airport.

The 1976 agreement includes certain limitations on airport operations (e.g., size of aircraft, hours of operation, etc.) and ensures that the airport will remain a general aviation airport and not become a commercial airport. The 1976 agreement also establishes the City's role in the Camarillo Airport Authority, an advisory body that makes recommendations to the Ventura County Board of Supervisors, which has final decision-making authority on all airport matters.

During public comment, concerns were voiced by numerous residents—especially those living under the flight path in Old Town—about the impacts of flight traffic (e.g., noise and emissions) on their quality of life. Other commenters, including some with airport-related jobs, spoke to the benefits the airport brings to Camarillo, especially economically.

"We've heard the concerns about airport noise and other impacts loud and clear, and we want to stress that preserving our quality of life in Camarillo is paramount," stated Mayor Tony Trembley. "The Council will continue to work hard to advocate these priorities to the Airport Authority and County officials, and we encourage the community to keep engaging in the participation opportunities for the airport layout plan and noise study."

City staff and special counsel Dan Reimer outlined the planning processes and addressed questions and concerns previously voiced about the airport, clarifying issues that may not have been well understood or represented accurately in the community. It was made clear that the County lacks authority to regulate air traffic—the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has exclusive jurisdiction over airspace, aircraft, and pilots. The County cannot close the airport—in fact, the County is obligated by contracts with the FAA that require the County to keep the airport open.

Because Ventura County owns and operates the Camarillo Airport (not the City), the County's Department of Airports is solely responsible for the two ongoing planning processes. The ALP does not include any airport expansion—it focuses on infrastructure, parking, ramps, and maintenance. The Part 150 Study, meanwhile, updates the airport's noise exposure maps

and addresses its noise compatibility program. There is no formal relationship between the ALP Update and the Part 150 Study.

In the detailed question-and-answer session with Director Freitas and Special Counsel Reimer, both expressed the difficulties of making significant operational changes within the restrictive framework of federal governance of general aviation airports. Despite the known hurdles, Director Freitas spoke of the airport's commitment to consider all realistic options to reduce impacts to the community, including educating pilots and flight-based operations on the County's voluntary Fly Friendly noise abatement practices as well as exploring the possibility of flight path modifications.

The City has no legal authority over the airport, only traditional land use and zoning. The City's power comes through the 1976 Agreement. To that end, the City Council has been assertive in defending the 1976 Agreement, hiring special legal counsel, forming a Camarillo Airport Ad Hoc Committee, engaging a third-party consulting firm to prepare and implement a scientifically-based survey of Camarillo residents, and prioritizing transparent communication and engagement with residents on airport-related matters.

"Our 1976 Agreement calls for the County and City to engage in mutual cooperation in the operation of the airport," shared Councilmember Susan Santangelo. "With Director Freitas' commitment to listening to our community's concerns, I trust we can find some common ground and realistic solutions as these processes move forward. To the extent we can use our voices on the Airport Authority to help mitigate impacts, we absolutely will."

The ALP is now in final draft form, and the public comment period is open through May 10, 2024. The next community meeting for the Part 150 Noise Study is scheduled for June 3, 2024. Information on both County processes can be found at: <u>vcairports.org</u>.
